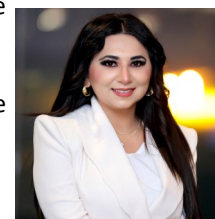

## Deferment and Suspension

### What is deferment, when and how to apply?

To defer or suspend enrolment means to temporarily put studies on hold (adjourn, delay, postpone). Providers do this by notifying the Department of Education, through Provider Registration and International Student Management System (PRISMS) of the deferment or suspension of enrolment. Deferment will only apply because of a serious illness or injury, 'Compassionate or compelling' circumstances are generally those beyond the control of the overseas student and which have an impact upon the overseas student's course progress or wellbeing. These could include but are not limited to, serious illness or injury, where a medical certificate states that the overseas student was unable to attend classes, bereavement of close family members such as parents or grandparents (where possible a death certificate should be provided), major political upheaval or natural disaster in the home country requiring emergency travel and this has impacted on the overseas student's studies, a traumatic experience, which could include or involvement in, or witnessing of a serious accident; or witnessing or being the victim of a serious crime, and this has impacted on the overseas student (these cases should be supported by police or psychologists' reports). If the student will be outside of Australia during the period of deferment then it is crucial for international students to obtain approval from their education provider before leaving the country if they wish to defer their studies. This ensures that the education provider is informed and agrees to the temporary suspension of the student's enrollment.

### Required documents for deferment.

Deferment form which is available on the ASLI website.

Evidence to support your deferment (We can only accept documents in English)

Tickets if travelling overseas.
